FEEDBACK

A mechanism is needed to get feedback from the schools and sites. Feedback can be generated from the hospitals' orientations, healthcare summits, CCNE, ACEN, graduate follow-ups, alumni associations and their Facebook pages.

For the February 9, Clinical Subcommittee meeting:

- ✓ Site Clinical Subcommittee members are asked to determine if there are things that are bothersome or roadblocks to clinical placement. Members are asked to share their findings.
- ✓ ACEN & CCNE – Members are asked to bring their standards so best practices can be shared.
- ✓ Debbie will share a feedback form draft that could be linked on the website.

MAY AND MAY NOT DO LIST FOR INSTRUCTOR LED CLINICALS

- There will be **no** GGBHA branding on the form. It will **not** be linked on the GGBHA website.
- All of the schools will use the same template, but will update their specific information.
- The document will clearly identify school information, with skills adjusted per school.
- The form will be distributed by faculty at the site.
- Faculty will ask the unit coordinators where they would like for them to post the list.
- The form could be used starting spring 2018.
- This form will be discussed at the hospitals' orientation in August.

HSHS SCRUB COLORS

Each HSHS department is going to be designated by a certain scrub color worn by staff. Clarification is needed, as to what color of scrubs students can wear at HSHS. **Karolyn will follow-up and send an email to the subcommittee.**

CLINICAL PLACEMENT SOFTWARE

A statewide agreement is needed before trying to move forward individually.

STATEWIDE HEALTHCARE ALLIANCE

Gwen was contacted by Milwaukee Healthcare Alliance reps indicating they would like to look at the GGBHA modules. Gwen will suggest using GGBHA's modules as a basis for the Statewide Alliance modules. Reps will be needed from each of the Alliances to share in the creation of the statewide modules.

RECRUITMENT OF STUDENTS INTO HEALTHCARE CAREERS

How do we recruit students into healthcare careers? This will be a 2018 goal. NWTC has a waiting list for all of their nursing programs; however, their lists are not as long as they used to be. In addition, their MA program has not been to capacity in the last three to four years. Their MA program is only offered in Green Bay, but the LPN is offered at a number of schools within the district. NWTC does offer an MA blended program and has two start dates per year. Currently, there are too many openings for MA's but not enough students.

- Bellin is coming to NWTC through their Career Services Department to do a lunch and learn. They will discuss the hiring process.
 - Rasmussen College is hosting a 'Meet & Greet' in conjunction with a 'Lunch & Learn'. They also hold an educational Family Fun Night once per quarter in an effort to boost enrollments.
 - NWTC has tables at The Einstein Project event to promote science careers and their programs.
 - NWTC now has career coaches in some of the regional high schools. They also have instructors teaching the CNA program in all four of the Green Bay high schools, with plans to expand into other schools.
 - NWTC offers the PN program starting the junior year of high school. If timed correctly, Youth Options can pay for the first year of the PN program. The student who graduates high school in June can potentially graduate from the PN program the following December. Students need to know ahead of time they want to do this.
 - The Group Career Exploration Events can be used to promote healthcare programs.
- ✓ **Gwen will follow-up with the Group Career Exploration Committee, in an effort to promote healthcare careers. It was recommended that NWTC's high school career coaches participate on the Group Career Exploration Committee.**

CNA Grant – Wisconsin Caregiver Program

Cindy Theys reported the program is moving slowly. Participants must pass a background check prior to enrolling. 13 of 16 Wisconsin technical colleges are participating. For more information, visit the [DHS website](#).

AURORA MERGER

Gwen shared that Aurora Health Care is merging with Advocate Health Care at the end of April. Advocate is the largest health system in Illinois. The new organization will become the 10th largest not-for-profit health care system in the U.S. They will be serving people throughout the Midwest.
